Education initiatives and community events receive Community Development Fund support

WHITEHORSE—The Yukon government is providing 17 community organizations with more than \$176,000 through the Community Development Fund (CDF) to support education and recreation projects and community events.

"The purpose of the Community Development Fund is to support and empower community organizations to undertake projects that contribute to the social and economic well-being of Yukoners," Economic Development Minister Currie Dixon said. "Whether it's enhancing tourism resources, creating education opportunities or promoting culture through community events, the program has the flexibility to meet the diverse needs of Yukon communities."

The Silver Trail Chamber of Commerce & Tourism Association is receiving \$16,348 to replace the 30-year-old tourism kiosk at Stewart Crossing.

"The new kiosk will change the dynamics of how people experience the Silver Trail and allow us to enhance our promotion of it in a way that is attractive and relevant to visitors," the association's president Richard Reid said. "We wouldn't have been able to move ahead without the CDF funding, and it has helped us attract other partners for this project including Yukon Energy, Martin Construction and Victoria Gold."

The Yukon Church Heritage Society will receive \$10,000 to restore the oakum chinking on the Old Log Church Museum in Whitehorse.

"The Old Log Church Museum dates back to 1900 and is one of the oldest buildings in Whitehorse," the society's president Linda Thistle said. "The community development funding was essential in allowing us to restore the chinking and preserve the integrity of the historic building for the benefit of the community in Whitehorse and the rest of Yukon."

The Community Development Fund offers three funding levels. Tier 1 funding is available for requests up to \$20,000. Tier 2 funding is for applicants requesting \$20,001 to \$75,000 and Tier 3 funding is for requests over \$75,000. The next intake deadline is September 13 for Tier 2 applications.

Organizations are encouraged to contact the Community Development Advisors well before the deadlines for assistance with their applications and developing project ideas.
