More than \$1.3 million in sport and recreation funding announced

WHITEHORSE—Partnerships between the Government of Yukon, Yukon Lottery Commission and Sport Canada have made more than \$1.3 million in grants available to Yukon's sport and recreation community.

"Sport and recreation organizations, our athletes, coaches and officials contribute tremendously to building healthy and vibrant communities throughout Yukon," Minister of Community Services Brad Cathers said. "I am pleased to announce our continued funding to these groups and individuals."

This year, 26 different sport organizations will receive financial support through the Yukon Sport 4 Life program. The High Performance program will fund 34 individual officials and athletes and the Elite Athlete Program will invest in five Yukon athletes who have been identified by national sport organizations. In total, 30 sport organizations and six recreational groups will receive funding through the Yukon Recreation Advisory Committee.

"Thanks to these annual grants, there are great opportunities in Yukon communities for children and youth to engage in active, healthy and fun activities," Recreation and Parks Association of the Yukon executive director Anne Morgan said. "By supporting local leaders, ensuring resources and access to training, this funding has a positive impact on the quality of life for many children and youth across Yukon."

Yukon Recreation Advisory Committee (YRAC)

The Yukon Recreation Advisory Committee (YRAC) is made up of six representatives of the sport community from across Yukon. They meet once per year to adjudicate annual funding

applications from Yukon's sport and recreation organizations. The current members of YRAC are Tim Brady-Whitehorse (Chair), Marg White-Whitehorse, Benita Parkkari-Whitehorse, Sharon Peter-Mayo, Johnny Nunan-Dawson, Bill Stonehouse-Whitehorse.

Funding for the annual YRAC grants is made possible by a revenue sharing agreement between the Yukon Lottery Commission and the Yukon government. It is administered through the Department of Community Services' Sport & Recreation Branch.

Yukon Sport 4 Life Program

The Yukon Sport 4 Life (YS4L) program was established in 2008. It supports coach and athlete development in the territory with a specific focus on encouraging rural and First Nation participation in sport. As well as providing annual grants, the program also supports the Kids Recreation Fund, Respect in Sport programs, the In-Territory Travel Fund, the Physical Literacy program, the Moving to Inclusion initiative and the Special Olympics Development Games.

Yukon Sport 4 Life is funded by the Government of Yukon and a bilateral funding arrangement with Sport Canada. Sports organizations across the territory apply through a proposal process which is adjudicated by a peer group of sport experts and a member of YRAC.

High Performance Funding

This program is specifically for Yukon athletes selected by their sport organization. The training and development of sport officials may also be supported through this program. The High Performance program is funded through a revenue sharing agreement between the Yukon Lottery Commission and the Government of Yukon.

Elite Athlete Program

The Elite Athlete program is supported by the Yukon government as part of the Yukon Sport 4 Life (YS4L) program and focuses on Yukon's Carded Athletes*.

(*A Carded Athlete is someone identified by Sport Canada as having the greatest potential to achieve top results at Olympic/Paralympic Games and World Championships. See Athlete Assistance Program for more details.)
