Arts Fund helps community organizations grow appreciation for the arts

WHITEHORSE—Fifteen projects are sharing \$221,278 through the Government of Yukon Arts Fund to further art appreciation in Yukon communities.

"The Arts Fund enables organizations across all Yukon communities to present art activities that expand cultural appreciation," Minister of Tourism and Culture Mike Nixon said. "These projects will encourage the professional growth of artists and give audiences new ways of looking at art."

Ynklude Art Society is receiving \$21,060 to develop and present a multimedia stage production with the support of its members that includes professional and emerging artists. The theme of the production is living with a person who lives with a disability.

"We are extremely proud of our diverse membership which ranges in age from youth to seniors," Ynklude executive director Julie Robinson said. "We enjoy bringing homegrown productions to our local community that offer insights into what inspires us while helping to educate and entertain and give audiences new ways to appreciate the arts."

The Town of Watson Lake is receiving \$15,000 to present Arts in the Park from June to September. The community will enjoy live performances by local musicians.

"We're grateful for the opportunity to bring local talent together in one place for youth, families and visitors to enjoy," Arts in the Park program manager Meaghen Kimmitt said. "We're also excited to carry on programming again this year that encourages healthy hobbies and lifestyles."

The Arts Fund supports projects that foster the development of the arts in Yukon communities. The next application deadline is March 17.
