Funding programs expand opportunity for arts in Yukon

WHITEHORSE—The Yukon government has announced that twelve recipients will share approximately \$98,000 of support from the Arts Fund and Touring Artist Fund.

"Through its funding programs the Yukon government is proud to support touring opportunities for Yukon artists as well as projects that encourage public participation in the arts here at home," Minister of Tourism and Culture Mike Nixon said. "Yukoners enjoy community arts events, while audiences outside the territory enjoy the creativity of our talented touring artists."

Eleven group projects that foster creative development and enhance local public participation of the arts in Yukon will receive funding through the Arts Fund. The Moosehide Cultural Society is receiving \$10,000 from the Arts Fund for the 2014 Moosehide Gathering, a biennial celebration of Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in (Hän) culture and tradition.

"By bringing together people from Dawson, the Yukon and beyond the territory's borders, the Gathering allows for the sharing of both traditional and contemporary First Nations arts and culture," Moosehide Gathering coordinator Tyla Crowe said. "Music, dance and stories create deeply significant moments of interchange between elders and youth, native and non-native individuals, and multiple First Nations. This takes on a deep cultural significance for the Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in community."

Touring Artist Fund support has been awarded to one successful applicant. Whitehorse musician Daniel Ashley is receiving \$7,333 to tour Canada and the U.S. with musicians Duncan Smith and Nick Middleton of The Funk Hunters.

"The goal of the tour is to launch my new solo brand DASH, increase my national and international exposure and create more opportunities for myself as an independent performing artist based in Yukon," Ashley said. "My collaboration with The Funk Hunters is giving me a whole new level of performance expertise and enhancing my multi-platform musical skills."
