Decision

The Department of Highways and Public Works has searched the Access and Privacy branch and has located records responsive to Access Request #22-439. Our final response on the information is as follows:

Access Granted in Full

The Department of Highways and Public Works has provided access in full to records relating to the request noted below:

All communications/e-mails/phone logs pertaining to privacy breach on Aug 24, 2022 reported to me on letter dated Sept 15, 2022. I would like to see all attempts to contact the individual who received this information in error. I want to see all communications that HPW ATIPP office sent and received from the applicant and the communications they provided to Dept of Education once breach was noticed. I want to see all communications that Dept of Education sent internally, to HPW ATIPP office, to IPC notifying them of the breach. I want to see the spreadsheet the Dept of education sent to the applicant. Timeframe: July 1, 2022 - September 23, 2022

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Question from Dept: "all communications that HPW office sent and received from the applicant and...", seems to indicate that there is an applicant.

Who is the "applicant" that the ATIPP Office would be communicating with? Is that the applicant for this ATIPP or someone else?

Response from App: Hello, the beginning of the request states that I want information about the privacy breach that the dept of education sent me a letter about. A newspaper article says it was an atipp request. So the applicant in this case is whoever made the atipp request involving the breach. That make sense?

There will be no charge for this request.


