



Good afternoon Heather,

I hope your week is going well.

We've recently become aware, through the Gwich'in Tribal Council (GTC), of concern about visible debris and potential hydrocarbon/chemical contamination that is currently present at the old Shell site J-21 along the Caribou River. This site is on the Yukon side of the NWT-Yukon border but the water flows into the Peel River. This site has previously (early 2000s) undergone a cleanup that was administered by INAC, where contaminants including DDT were reported; PCBs might also have been a concern. Although the clean-up was done back in 2000, the changing hydrology and dynamic system make more debris (which was apparently buried on site at the time of exploration) more likely to surface now and then.

The GTC representatives have been in communication with Shell and have also contacted Crystal Trudeau with Yukon Government and a representative of DFO for updated information and to understand the regulatory process. We understand that Shell notified Yukon's spill line (I'm not sure when) and I have confirmed that there has been no notification to the NWT Spill Line.

As we have a newly minted Bilateral Water Management Agreement, we should talk about process in emergencies and spills. Our agreement states the following:

12. Emergency Response

a) Each Party will ensure that emergency response protocols are in place to address, mitigate, and where possible prevent, adverse effects of Emergencies on the Ecological Integrity of the Aquatic Ecosystem of the other Party.

- b) The protocols will ensure that the Party within whose jurisdiction the Emergency originates will, without delay, notify the other Party.
- c) Each Party shall within its jurisdiction be responsible for any notification of the public and Indigenous Governments and Organizations.

Please let me know when you might have a chance to chat about process and next steps.

Good Afternoon Crystal,

Thanks for taking my call today. As I mentioned to you on the call, GTC, as well as the community of Fort McPherson (Abe Wilson – Tetlit Council President – cc'd) is concerned about the visible debris and potential hydrocarbon/chemical contamination that is currently present at the old Shell site J-21 along the Caribou River. This site has previously (early 2000s) undergone a cleanup that was administered by INAC, where contaminants including DDT were reported.

GTC and the Tetlit Council had a virtual meeting with Shell on September 1st, where Shell indicated that the exposed debris could be associated with an old oil and gas associated landfill/waste pit. Some of the plastic debris has "Drilling Fluid Services Ltd." logos, as well as polyliners, etc. which suggests potential hydrocarbon storage/disposal. Shell was first made aware of the debris in 2020, when a local Tetlit participant took photos of the site and sent it to them. Due to Covid, they were only able to conduct site assessments this year, and the attached information was provided to GTC. To date, Shell indicated that they reported the site to the Yukon Spill/ tip reporting line, they mentioned that they are working with a Yukon Conservation Officer and DFO. However, as the current fee simple title landowner of the parcel (R-5FS), we have some major concerns with regards to this contamination.

Via this email, GTC is formally requesting an update from your Department on the regulatory process that is currently being undertaken, to address the contamination at the site. Any information or update would be greatly appreciated.

As to your question regarding regulatory process, under our legal framework we require evidence of a spill and a clear responsible party to issue an environmental protection order to remediate. In this case it appears Shell is agreeing to take responsibility for the clean-up on a voluntary basis, which is ideal. We are able to assist them in providing guidance as to our remediation standards and protocols.

I do note we have not received a spill report from Shell or anybody for this site, to date. Could you please share your contact at Shell?
