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## **NON-CONSOLIDATED SUMMARIES**

## Accounting Reporting Change Restatement

Effective for the fiscal year 2012-13, the Government is required to adopt the new accounting standards for government transfers and tax revenues issued by the Public Sector Accounting Board. The accounting changes have been applied retroactively and all comparative year amounts presented in this document are restated.

In summary, the major effect of these accounting changes is to increase the 2010-11 opening Accumulated Surplus by \$530,217,000. The restated figures detailed below have not been audited and are included only to reflect prior periods on a comparative basis to the 2012-13 Main Estimates presentation.

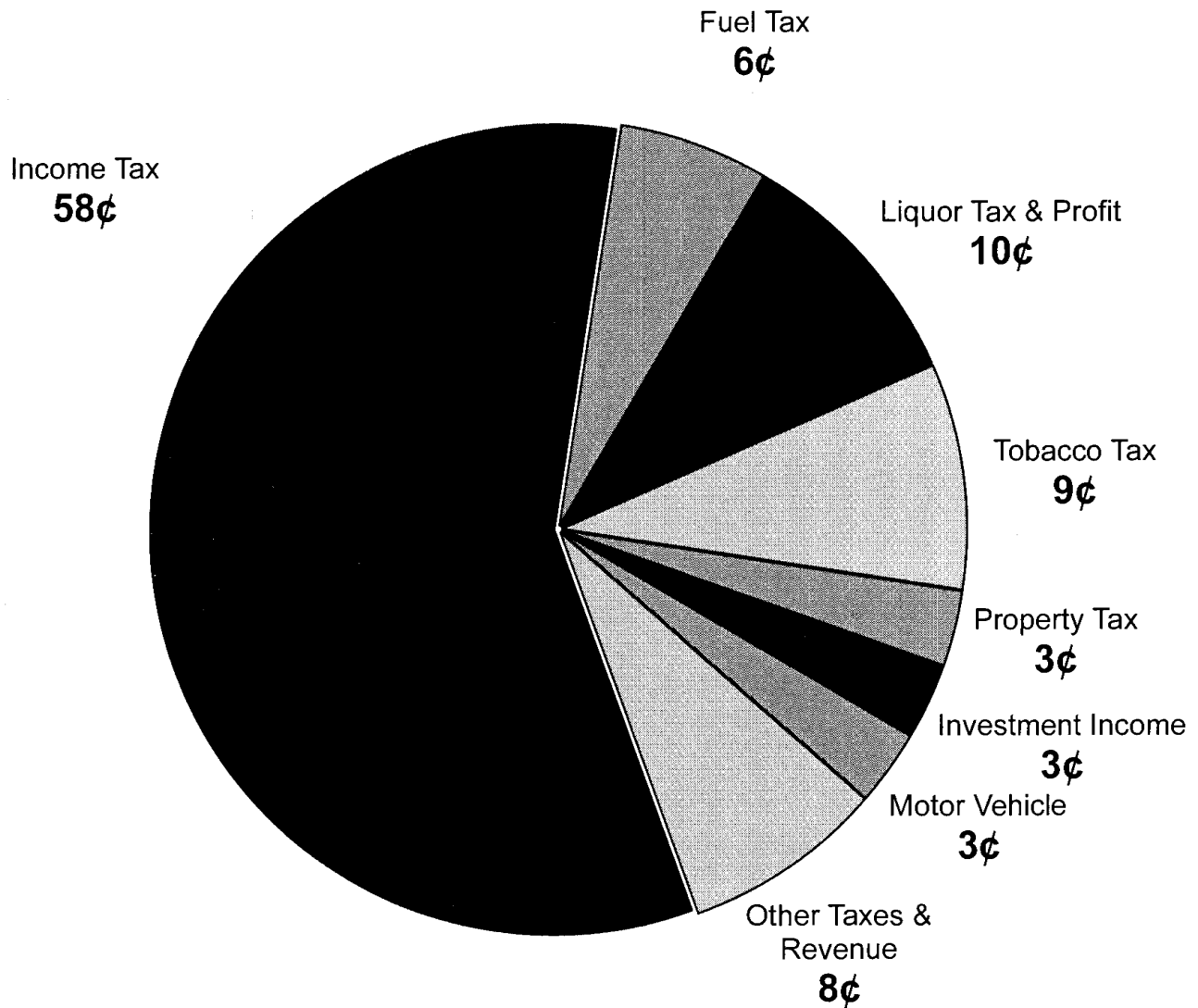

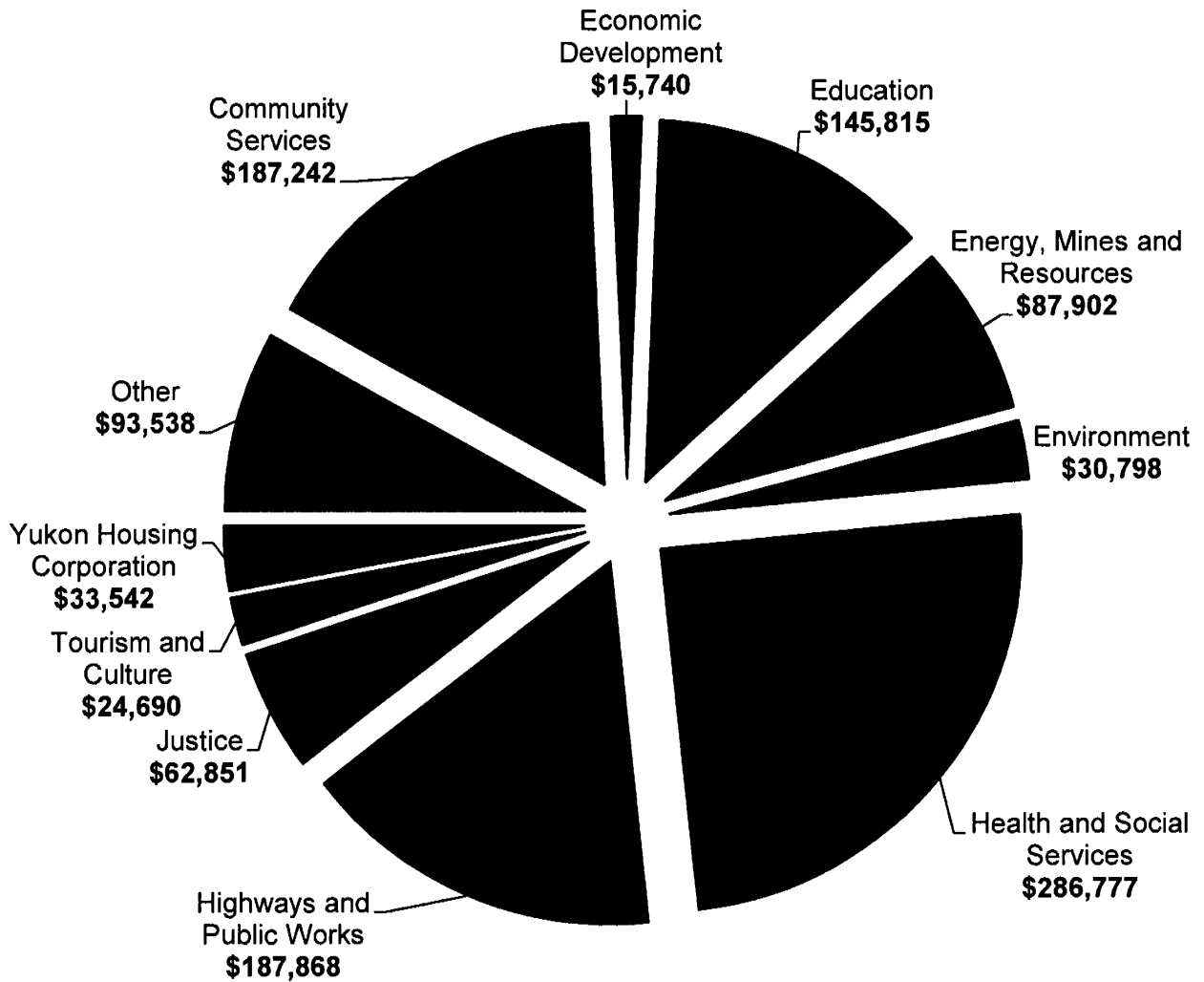
- (1) Rate changes may have occurred since the time of the survey (February, 2012). Reference should be made to each jurisdiction's Department of Finance to determine current rates or upcoming rate changes.
- (2) Income tax brackets are indexed using the Consumer Price Index in New Brunswick, Saskatchewan, Northwest Territories, Nunavut, and Yukon.
- (3) The following jurisdictions levy a surcharge on personal income tax: Prince Edward Island - 10% of provincial tax in excess of \$12,500; Ontario - 20% of provincial tax in excess of \$4,213 and 36% of provincial tax in excess of \$5,392; Yukon - 5% of territorial tax in excess of \$6,000.
- (4) Provincial share of Harmonized Sales Tax for Newfoundland, New Brunswick, and Nova Scotia. British Columbia and Ontario moved to Harmonized Sales Tax July 1, 2010. Following a July 2011 referendum decision British Columbia will revert to a provincial sales tax. Harmonized sales tax will be eliminated by March 31, 2013.
- (5) Prince Edward Island - Tax rate for both gas and diesel includes 10.7% tax on the estimated wholesale price (to a maximum of 8.7 cents per litre). The flat rate component is 11.5 cents per litre for diesel and 7.1 cents per litre for gasoline, plus 10.7% *ad valorem* component. The tax rates change on the first day of each month. The rates listed are for February 2012.
- (6) New Brunswick - Small business rate decreased from 4.5% effective January 1, 2012. General corporate income tax rate lowered from 11% on July 1, 2011. Effective March 23, 2011 tobacco tax increased from 11.75 cents per cigarette to 17 cents per cigarette, gasoline tax increased from 10.7 cents per litre and diesel tax increased from 16.9 cents per litre. Provincial share of Harmonized Sales Tax lowered to 10% July 1, 2011.
- (7) Nova Scotia - Small business rate was reduced from 4.5% effective January 1, 2012. There is currently no surtax; however if Nova Scotia tables a budget surplus in its 2012-2013 fiscal year, for 2012 the \$150,000 bracket and the 21% rate will be eliminated, and the 10% surtax on provincial income exceeding \$10,000 will be reinstated.
- (8) Quebec - Quebec Sales Tax increased from 8.5% and tobacco tax increased from 10.6 cents per cigarette on January 1, 2012. Gasoline and diesel tax will increase by 1 cent per litre April 1 each year until 2013. Gasoline rate includes 0.8 cent per litre carbon tax; diesel rate includes 0.9 cent per litre carbon tax.
- (9) Ontario - General corporate income tax rate reduced from 12% July 1, 2011 and will be further reduced to 11% July 1, 2012 and to 10% July 1, 2013.
- (10) Manitoba - The small business income tax was eliminated as of December 1, 2010.
- (11) Saskatchewan - Small business rate decreased from 4.5% on July 1, 2011.
- (12) British Columbia - Fuel tax rates are for fuel on highways and include carbon tax rates of 5.56 cents per litre for gas and 6.39 cents per litre for diesel. Rates do not include regional taxes that increase the rates by 9 cents per litre in South Coast BC transportation service area and by 3.5 cents in the Capital Regional District. Carbon tax will increase July 1, 2012 to 6.67 cents per litre for gasoline and to 7.67 cents per litre for diesel.
- (13) Northwest Territories - Two tax rates exist for gasoline - for highway usage (10.7 cents per litre) and for off-highway usage (6.4 cents per litre). The 6.4 cent rate applies for communities not on the highway system. Effective April 1, 2010 policies were implemented to ensure that tobacco tax rates will increase each year at the rate of inflation. Tobacco tax increased effective April 1, 2011 from 27.4 cents per cigarette to 28.6 cents per cigarette.
- (14) Nunavut has the same two rate system for gas tax as the Northwest Territories. The same gas tax rates apply. Effective February 24, 2012 tobacco tax increased by 4 cents per cigarette from 21 cents to 25 cents per cigarette.

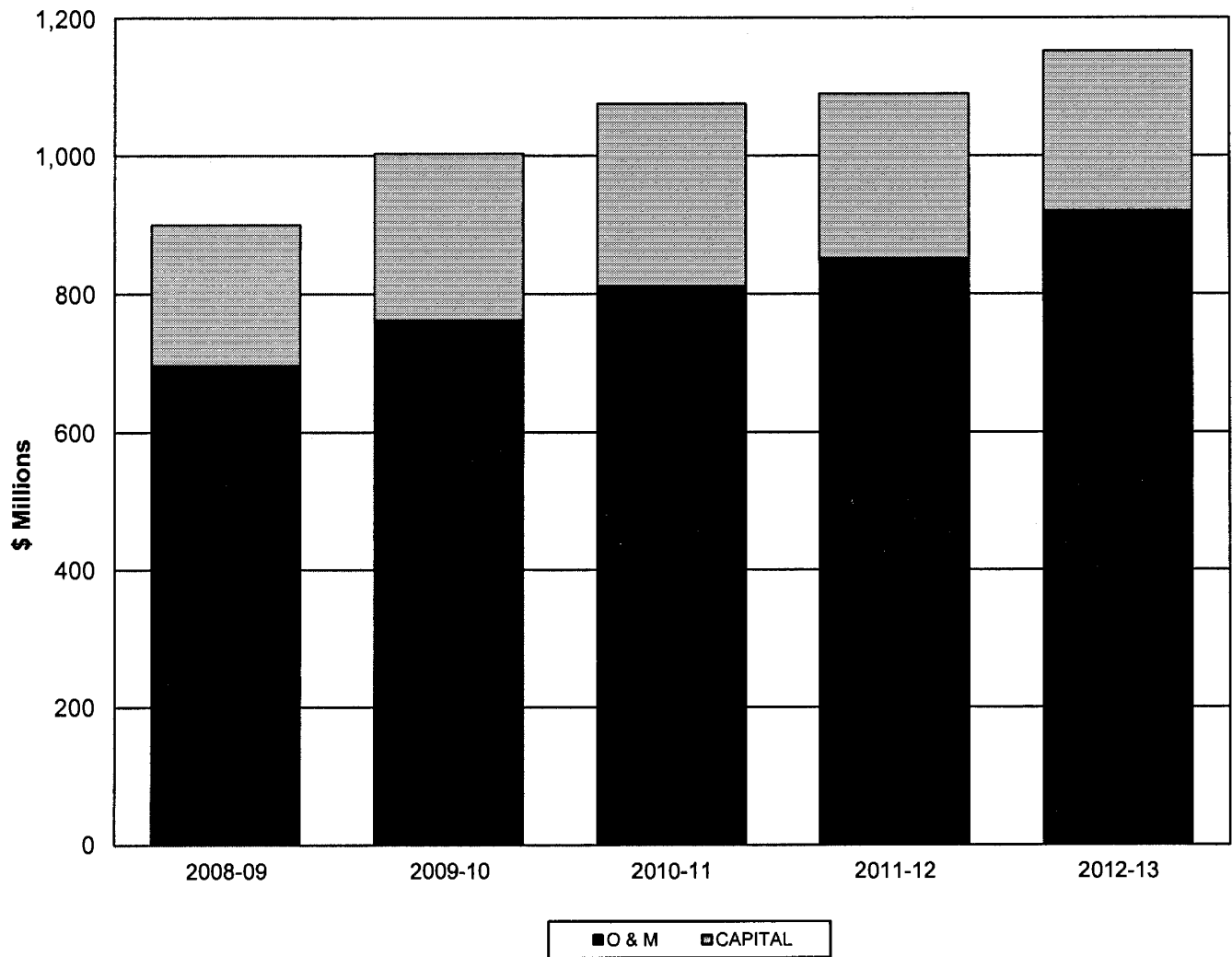
